Table tennis body files to stop lawsuit

The T&T Table Tennis Association (TTTTA) is seeking to stop an ongoing lawsuit challenging the process it used to select representatives for the recently concluded Commonwealth Games.

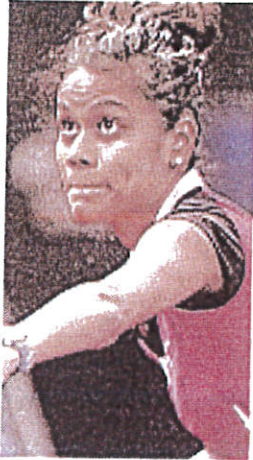
The association's lawyers made the application on Monday as it amended its defense to the claim brought by Dexter St Louis and his stepdaughter Rheann Chung, earlier this year.

It is claiming that the duo should be precluded from pursuing the claim as they had suggested that the dispute is resolved by the T&T Olympic Committee (TTOC)'s arbitration panel. The association blanked the request as it said that it had the sole remit to refer such disputes to arbitration.

It is also alleging that the lawsuit is academic as St Louis and Chung were eventually allowed to compete at the games in Australia, earlier this month, alongside the association's initial picks Aaron Wilson and Yuvraj Dookram.

During the hearing before Justice Eleanor Donaldson-Honeywell in the Port-of-Spain High Court, the association's attorneys challenged her previous wasted costs order, under which they (association's legal team) were required to pay St Louis and Chung's legal costs for bringing the lawsuit.

The order was granted as St

Louis and Chung claimed that they would not have been forced to file the lawsuit if they (the attorneys) had advised the association to approve the arbitration.

Donaldson-Honeywell agreed and decided to vacate her previous order. She also gave directions for the lawsuit and adjourned it to July 16.

In the lawsuit, St Louis, 50, and 33-year-old Chung, the most decorated athletes to ever represent T&T in the sport, are questioning the process used by the association to select 19-year-old

Wilson and 21-year-old Dookram for the Games.

They are seeking damages for breach of contract, conspiracy and unlawful interference.

In its defense, the TTTTA is claiming that the duo was informed via email of the selection criteria and chose not to participate. It also alleged that they only decided to challenge the process after it was completed.

The TTTTA is also claiming that it had closely followed the TTOC's guidelines and deadlines for selection, which focuses on

youth participation.

Donaldson-Honeywell had initially granted the duo an injunction barring any participants being chosen for the Games but it was eventually withdrawn after the parties came to a compromise through discussions

with the TTOC.

St Louis and Chung are being represented by Mathew Gayle, Sheriza Khan and Dr Emir Crowne, while Dinesh Rambally, Kiel Taklalsingh, and Stefan Ramkissoon are representing the TTTTA.

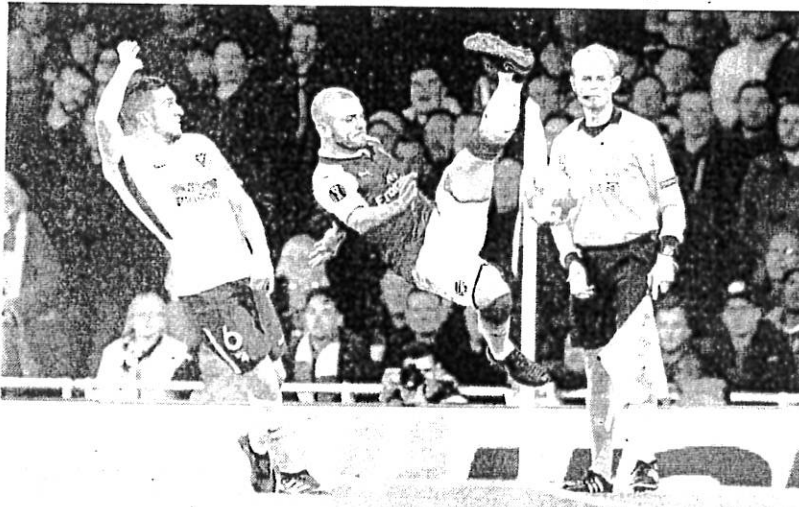

Arsenal held by 10-man Atletico

Antoine Griezmann fired in a late equaliser to help 10-man Atletico Madrid to a crucial 1-1 draw with Arsenal in the first leg of their Europa League semifinal yesterday. In the other semi-final Marseille saw off Salzburg 2-0 with goals on either side of the half at the Stade Orange Velodrome, Marseille, France.

At the Emirates Stadium in London, Diego Simeone's team found themselves down a man just after 10 minutes when Sime Vrsaljko was sent off after receiving his second yellow following a studs-up tackle on Alexandre Lacazette.

Minutes later, the Atletico boss was sent to the stands for dissent for

protesting the second caution on Vrsaljko and calling for a card on Hector Bellerin for a foul on Lucas Hernandez.

Arsenal began to find space easily in the attacking third, with Danny Welbeck forcing a good save from Jan Oblak on 20 minutes before Laurent Koscielny sent his back post volley into the side netting.

Griezmann tested David Ospina just before half-time with the visitors' best chance of the opening 45 minutes, stinging the Arsenal keeper's hands with a swerving volley from just outside the area.

The hosts finally found their opener just after the hour mark when Lacazette out-

jumped two Atletico defenders to head home a Jack Wilshere cross.

Lacazette then went close to doubling his tally -- and Arsenal's -- on the day, but his header from a Granit Xhaka corner skipped just wide of the far post.

And Atleti would make Arsenal pay in the 82nd minute, when Griezmann ran down a Jose Gimenez long ball over the top of the defence, beat Koscielny to the ball and shot into the roof of the net to level the score and give his side a massive away goal.

The teams will play the second leg at the Wanda Metropolitan on May 3 to determine who will go the final in Lyon.
