Applications will be accepted from ten (10) working days prior to the auction date. The deadline for submission of tenders to the Reserves and Domestic Market Management Department of the Central Bank is 12:00 noon on the auction date.

Payments for bills must be made by certified cheque payable to the Central Bank of Trinidad and Tobago and must accompany each tender. Cheque payments must be submitted no later than three (3) working days prior to the auction date. Cashiers are open 8:00am to 12:00 noon Monday to Thursday and 8:00am to 2:30pm on Friday.

Competitive tenders can be submitted for any amount up to the issue size and must state the price the bidder is willing to pay for each \$1,000 of the face value being applied for. Competitive bids may be rejected if the face value of the entire issue is allocated at higher bid prices or if the price quoted is lower than the cut-off price set by the Central Bank. No allocation will be made to a bid that is rejected.

Non-competitive tenders for values up to \$100,000 can also be submitted. For these bids, the bidder agrees to accept the weighted average price of the successful bids determined in the competitive auction.

determined; I propose to pay the minimum public service pension of \$3,500 per month immediately upon the retirement of the public servant.

This coupled with the \$3,000 NIS pension per month will provide significant and early financial relief for 1,500 public servants who took compulsory retirement, were entitled to pensions and had a minimum of ten years' service. This group of public servants include the civil service, the teaching service, the protective services and the legislature. This measure will take effect on January 1, 2019 and will cost \$63.0 million. This amount will also address outstanding pension payments.

It is to be noted that this measure is not intended to be permanent and we intend to move aggressively in 2019 to improve the efficiency and completeness of the pension and leave records systems across the public service to ensure prompt payment of pensions to public servants upon retirement

Reward and Allocation for Crime Stoppers

Madam Speaker, the Ministry of National Security receives on average approximately \$7.0 billion per annum

which supports crime prevention and detection. At present, Crime Stoppers offers up to \$10,000 in rewards or higher depending on the nature of the crime. To further incentivise persons to offer information, we are proposing that rewards up to \$100,000 be offered for information on the 25 most wanted criminals as identified by the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service which will lead to the successful conviction of those persons. The focal point of this strategic intervention will be crimes related to murder and kidnapping.

Madam Speaker, I therefore propose that the budgetary allocation for Crime Stoppers be increased by an additional \$2.5 million to support its operations in the identification and reporting of criminal activities. This measure will take effect on January 1, 2019.

24/7 Opening Hours for Remote Health Centres

Madam Speaker, we acknowledge the significant health challenges which are faced daily by remote communities. The Government is proposing to have those health centres located in remote areas opened on a 24 hour/7 days basis in an effort to deal with community



TT captures gold at Canada Open Taekwondo

ODYSSEUS PETROPOULOS captured a gold medal, in the Under-63 kg Junior Male division, at the Canada open International Taekwondo Competition recently.

The 16-year-old has represented TT at the 2016 Junior World Championship in Burnaby, BC, Canada; the Pan American Junior Championships in San Jose, Costa Rica in 2017; and the Youth Olympic Taekwondo Qualifier and World Taekwondo Junior Championships in Hammamet, Tunisia in April.

Odysseus comes from a Taekwondo family. His mother is the Trinidad-born Lisa-Mae Petropoulos (formerly Achue) and his Greece-born Canadian father Demetre Petropoulos has over 30 years' experience in the sport and coaches his son at all his international events.

Both Odysseus and Lisa-Mae achieved double golds at the Canada Open in 2015 and 2018.

Odysseus competes in the sparring events and Lisa-Mae com-

petes in the martial arts. She is currently on the Canada team and is expected to compete at the Taipei 2018 World Taekwondo Poomsae Championships in Taiwan this November.

Odysseus is a member of Young Choung Taekwondo Academy and started at the age of four. His ultimate goal is to qualify for the 2024 Olympic Games in France.

TT finish 3rd at Regional Table Tennis Champs

THE TT table tennis team finished third overall when the Caribbean Regional Table Tennis Federation 60th Senior Championships concluded in Kingston, Jamaica, on Saturday.

Dominican Republic dominated the tournament to end on top of the points standings with 1870 points, followed by Guyana with 1,010 points and TT with 520 points. Barbados had to settle for fourth place with 500 points.

In the team competitions, both the TT men and women grabbed bronze. Among the men, Dominican Republic took gold, Guyana snatched silver and TT and Barbados tied for third.

Dominican Republic also won the women's crown; Guyana end-

ed second and TT and Puerto Rico shared the bronze medal.

TT won three individual medals at the meet with David Mahabir, Brittany Joseph and Derron Douglas winning gold, silver and bronze respectively.

Mahabir copped gold

in the +45 men's singles, Barbadian Dale Rudder took silver and Jamaican Rudolph Sinclair and Juan Vila of Dominican Republic tied for third spot.

Joseph took silver in the Under-21 women's singles, finishing behind Guyanese Chelsea Edghill. Puerto Rican

Daymar Castro and Yarisiris Ortiz of Dominican Republic shared the bronze medal.

Douglas got on the podium sharing third place with Abit Tejada of Dominican Republic. Guyanese Shemar Britton won gold and Barbadian Tyrese Knight ended second.
